

1. OVET - Locations






2. COVID-19 – Facts & Figures

- Deepest worldwide recession since World War II
- ☐ Economic shrink from 2,5 to 10 %
- ☐ Number of deaths > 1.000.000
- ☐ Infected > 33.000.000

Coronavirus (COVID-19) cases, recoveries, and deaths worldwide as of Sep. 28, 2020





3. Approach

- ☐ Starting points measurements:
 - minimal impact on business operations
 - public support employees
 - workable situation pragmatic
 - > taking responsiblity but designated as a priority sector
- ☐ Determine approach
 - day by day follow-up national advice (RIVM)
 - > clear communication
 - creating public support employees involvement



4. Measurements

- ☐ General advice = distancing
- ☐ General measurements
 - Hand hygiene
 - ➤ Keep distance 1.5 m
 - Disease symptoms: contact HR stay home
 - Provide clear information
 - Disinfecting
- Office measurements
 - Temporary suspension all kind of physical meetings/appointments
 - Defining max people per space
 - Electronic meetings by Teams
 - Home work as max as possible
 - No visits third companies exceptions
 - No business trips
 - ➤ Abolish exchange physical information
 - Break: in own office, reorganised canteen 1.5 m distance, no birthday presents...



4. Measurements

- ☐ Terminal measurements
 - Strict separation between Terneuzen and Flushing
 - Staff: avoid contact between shifts
 - Ad hoc measurements
 - Company busses
 - Boarding ships
 - Subcontractors
- ☐ Preventive private
 - Avoid as much as possible: meetings, travelling, social contacts,...
 - > Travelling inform HR
 - Family members / close contacts inform HR
 - ➤ Home stay home!



5. Lessons learned

- ☐ Weakning follow-up measurements
 - > Repeat instructions
- ☐ Shared vigilance
 - Address each other
